Wakeboard events that award Asian ranking points:

Worldcup, World Championships (Open, Masters), Asian Beach Games, AO Championships, Asian Championships (Open, Masters), Asian Cup, Asian Open

- Points are given according to event ranking of each category
- → Minimum 5 riders & 5 different countries each category
 (Asian Championships : Minimum 3 riders & 3 different countries each category)
- → Judges from 3 different countries

• Point calculation system to encourage active riders and new challengers :

The latest grand total point is calculated by adding the composite points for the current year added by the previous year's composite points discounted by 20% and the points from two years ago discounted by 40%. If a rider is inactive for three consecutive years, all there points will be expired completely.
