The International Waterski & Wakeboard Federation (IWWF) is the world governing body for all towed water sports and has 91affiliated member Federations worldwide. It was founded in Geneva, Switzerland in 1946 and is recognised by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) as the sole authority governing all towed water sports. The IWWF is also an affiliate member of the Global Association of International Sport Federations (GAISF) and one of the seven founding sports of the World Games.

4.1. Introduction

Lebanon has always been a favourite when it comes to tourism, especially due to its beautiful natural sights, diverse environment and culinary reputation. Beirut, its capital, was also recently named best city in the world to eat in, according to a New York-based travel magazine.

Jounieh is a coastal city about 16 km north of Beirut, Lebanon and is part of Greater Beirut. Jounieh is known for its seaside resorts and bustling nightlife, as well as its old stone souk, ferry port, paragliding site and gondola lift (le téléphérique), which takes passengers up the mountain to the shrine of Our Lady of Lebanon in Harissa. Above Jounieh, and on the way to Harissa, a small hill named Bkerké overlooking the Jounieh bay, is the seat of the Patriarch of the Maronite Catholic Church. Residents of Jounieh and the surrounding towns are overwhelmingly Maronite Christians. Maameltein is a district of the city.

The Association called "Automobile and Touring Club of Lebanon", known by its acronym, the ATCL, was founded in 1919. Its purpose is the promotion of motor sport in particular and all sports in general, as well as the development tourism, in all its forms. In 1933, she was affiliated to the AIT (International Alliance of Tourism-Geneva) and the FIA (International Federation of the Automobile-Paris). It is located in Kaslik, near the famous bay of Jounieh.

The Automobile and Touring Club of Lebanon is the only association authorized in Lebanon to issue international customs documents, in accordance with the Geneva Agreement of $\frac{19/9/49}{19/9/49}$ and according to the International Agreement on International Traffic.

ATCL offers many activities in the sports, aquatic, Motorsports and nautical sectors. Competitions and events are held throughout the year, with the participation of local and international amateurs and athletes.



The event will be located at the ATCL Marina. The pass is expected to be exposed to open sea and the competition course is subject to change depending on the conditions.

5 GENERAL INFORMATION

5.1 WEATHER

In Lebanon, the month of September is characterized by an average high temperature of 31°C and an average low temperature of 20°C.

5.2 LOCAL CURRENCY

The local Currency is the Lebanese Pounds but USD is accepted. Exchange rate USD/LBP (1USD = 1507.5LBP) Visa and MasterCard are accepted in all hotels, shops and restaurants.

12. Age Categories

The age categories will be according to 2018.

Teams should select their teams based on the following age categories:

- U14 Born from 2003 on
- U18 Born from 1999 on
- OPEN Born from 1988 on (any rider regardless of their age can choose to participate in OPEN) MASTERS – Born in 1987 and before
- VETERANS Born in 1977 and before

13. National Flags & Anthems

Each team must bring 2 flags of its country. The flag should be no smaller than 70/100cm. All teams should bring or send via e-mail their National Anthem.

14. Eligibility

A Federation may select its team in any manner it desires (according to the 2018 IWWF Wakeboard Rules). However, each team member must be a citizen or applying for citizenship of the country that the Federation represents. In case of doubt as to the nationality of a competitor, the Chief Judge and Chief Calculator normally will refer to his/her passport. If a rider does not have a passport from the country he/she is representing, he/she must prove residence in the country for at least five years and membership in an affiliated club of the Federation. Each Federation shall certify that all members of its team meet these qualifications. Prior to competing, a competitor must sign a participation contract and understand the nature of the sport and its special risks, particularly in the format. It is the responsibility of the competitor to register with the designated registration person and show proof of Federation membership before riding. Competitors must disclose to the event organizer any special medical conditions, including but not limited to, injuries in the past or present or other pre-existing medical conditions.

For all riders: Each rider must complete a release of liability form and hand it at accreditation. Failure to do so will prevent the rider from participating. For minor riders only: a parental authorization is needed to participate in the competition. The federation of the rider will attest and be fully accountable that the authorization is official and genuine. Please read

Athletes should make travel arrangements to arrive at the main International Airport Beirut–Rafic Hariri International Airport (BEY).

The organising committee will arrange transportation for teams and officials from Beirut Airport to the Official Hotel, which is a 40 Minute drive away.
