IWWF History

The International Waterski and Wakeboard Federation (IWWF) is founded in 1946. The IWWF is recognized by the International Olympic Committee (IOC) as official partner since 1967. Wakeboarding is part of the World Games (Non Olympic Games patronized by IOC) since 2005. The IWWF has more than 90 Member Nations all over the World and is organizing the Nationals Championships together with this Federations all over the globe. IWWF is also organizing together with the Agencies and local Federations the IWWF World Championships, the IWWF World Cup, the IWWF World Trophy and hundreds of international Competitions all over the World. With worldwide more than 90 affiliate countries, hundreds of clubs and thousands of members the IWWF is the global leader in the sport of waterski and wakeboarding. The IWWF and its Cable Wakeboard World Council (CWWC) is a rider formed voluntary nonprofit working council and is organizing and promoting the wakeboard sport on a worldwide level. It is the leading group for organizing competitions, developing the Cable Wakeboard World Rules, formats, judging criteria's, educating Judges and helping organizers to running the competitions. The CWWC is specialist in running the sport Parts of Events under fair conditions for all riders, fair and fast judging, perfect just in time timetables, live and online results and TV Production Results Interfaces for Live Streaming or Live TV Productions. The Councils



The Councils are formed by voluntary people full of passion for the sport and are elected every two years by the [IWWF](http://www.iwwfed.com) confederation congresses. These volunteers take care of the development of Cable Wakeboarding - from organising competitions like the World or European Championships, the education of judges and officials, to managing the rankings and designing the rules.



These Councils are part of a much bigger structure - the [IWWF](http://www.iwwfed.com) (International Waterski & Wakeboard Federation). The IWWF is the governing body and part of the IOC (International Olympic Committee). The IWWF has Councils for 7 disciplines: Barefoot, Cableski, Disabled, Racing, Tournament (classic waterskiing), Wakeboard Boat and Wakeboard Cable .



Because different global regions have different needs the IWWF is splitted among three Confederations. These are PANAM (North and South America), AAO (Asia, Australia & Oceania) and the EA (Europe & Africa). Within these regions you will find almost the same structure as in the IWWF - different councils for all the different divisions. Cable Wakeboarding, which is most popular in Europe, is managed by the [ECWC - the European Cable Wakeboard Council](http://www.ecwc.org).

[CWWC - Cable Wakeboard World Council](http://www.cwwc.org) was formed only recently, in 2008, and is formed of 3 members from each Confederation.

Because of the fast pace of development of our sport, IWWF formed in 2009 the [Cable Development Committee](http://www.cabledevelopmentcommittee.org) with main aims to help establish the new projects worldwide and integrate them with IWWF structures.
